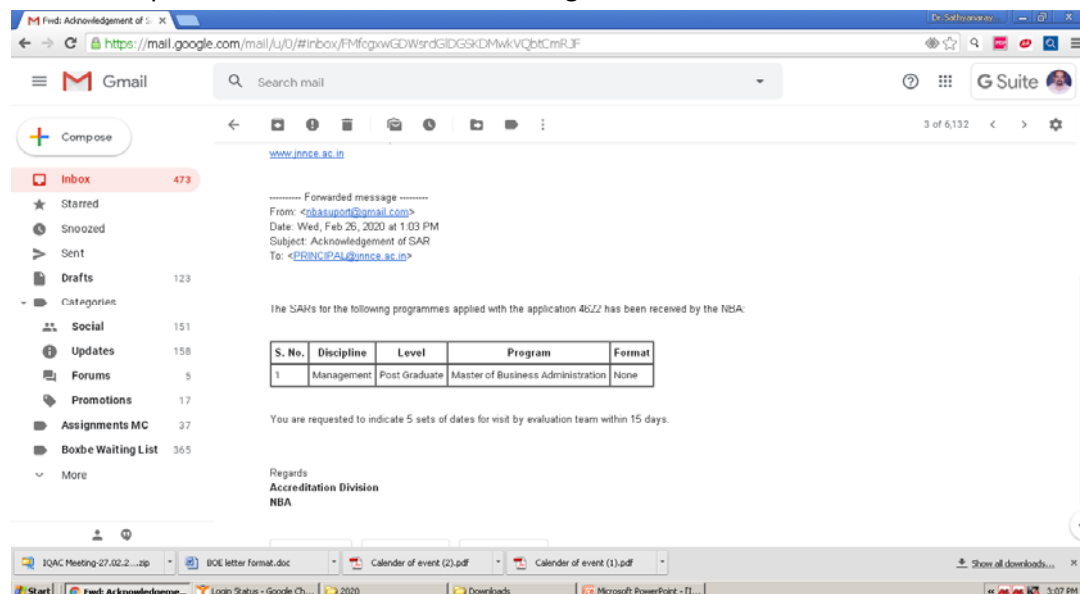

#### 6. Agenda Point 5: Professional Clubs

IQAC coordinator presented the preamble and proposal about the agenda:

##### **Preamble:**

Each year hundreds of thousands of students pass out of the colleges. Huge gap exists between the academia and industry, because the quality of education and skills imparted are not in accordance with the ever changing expectations & requirements of the industry. It is time that the academia act to improve the capability and employability of its student fraternity. This can be achieved by thought-provoking activities in an environment which engrosses the students. Such environment can be created by an association of people (Club) united by a common area of interest or goal.

**Status:** There are Department forums, Activities / Hobby clubs at CIE

**Proposal:** To start Professional Club for Augmented Learning.

**Name of the Club:** ALPHA – Augmented Learning Program for Higher Achievement

**Emblem of the Club:**



IQAC coordinator informed that Dr. K M Basappaji, Professor - Mechanical Engineering initiated the plan and will be coordinating the club. There are 12 mentors and 10 wings. Some more mentors would be enrolled.

##### **Mode of operation:**

The objective of the club is to inspire and enable members to acquire skills to achieve their professional goals. After enrollment in any of the wings of the club, the members engage in devising the avenues to involve in learning along with co-participants under the guidance of a mentor.



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The various wings of the club may function to achieve the objectives through the combination of following:

- Study
- Peer learning
- Discussions
- Brain storming
- Seminars/Lectures/Workshops
- Industry interactions
- Attending certification courses
- Executing projects

The activities are of perpetual nature, where the members contribute and enhance their Knowledge, but they don't have right to own the work.

#### **Wings of the Club:**

- Electric Vehicle
- Automation and Robotics
- Mechatronics
- Aero Modeling
- Energy and Environment
- Rural Technologies
- Artificial Intelligence and machine Learning
- HAM (Amateur Radio)
- Soft skills
- App Development

IQAC coordinator informed that three rounds of the meetings with club mentors were conducted to discuss the mode of operation of the club. To start with it was decided to prepare posters to make wide publicity and to get registrations from the students.

Dr. K. M. Basappaji informed that there would be need of a working space for the students to work. Also, he informed that once the students registered, interviews would be conducted by the members to select the students to test the seriousness among the students

Dr. M. G. Krishnamurthy suggested that project proposals may be submitted for various funding agencies and he was of the opinion that it would be a platform of inter-disciplinary ideas and the students would get the opportunity to explore different ideas. He suggested enrolling more mentors. He also opined that this could be platform for slow learners to improve themselves through peer-learning mechanism.

Mr. Suresh informed that the industry requires such clubs to be active and more industry-related problems / projects could be taken up by the students like Automation and Robotics.

Principal suggested that more students should enroll in such clubs and he gave the examples of other premier institutions where such clubs were completely managed by students. He also informed that local industries and existing MoUs could be involved and guidance could be taken.



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All the members appreciated the initiative and were of the opinion that these clubs would improve the technical skills of the students.

#### Recommendations:

1. All the members approved the launch of Professional Club – ALPHA
  2. It was decided to get the students registrations under the various Wings and conduct the interviews to confirm the enrollment.
  3. It was decided to enroll more mentors to make the club more active
  4. It was decided to identify a working space in the old Library Block and give access to students.
7. **Agenda Point 6:** AICTE activity points – Implementation Guidelines

IQAC coordinator presented the preamble and proposal about the agenda:

#### Preamble:

**Apart from technical knowledge and skills, to be successful as professionals, students should have excellent soft skills, leadership qualities and team spirit. They should have entrepreneurial capabilities and societal commitment. In order to match these multifarious requirement, AICTE has created a unique mechanism of awarding Activity Points over and above the academic grades.**

1. Every Day College regular student admitted to the 4 years Degree programme and every student entering 4 years Degree programme through lateral entry, shall earn 100 and 75 Activity Points respectively for the award of degree through AICTE Activity Point Programme. Students transferred from other Universities to fifth semester are required to earn 50 Activity Points from the year of entry to VTU. This is applicable to B.E/B.Tech. students taking admission starting from 2018-19: regular, 2019-20 : lateral entry admission and those joining 5<sup>th</sup> semester in 2020-21.

2. The Activity Points earned shall be reflected on the student's eighth semester Grade Card.

3. The activities can be spread over the years (duration of the programme), anytime during the semester weekends and holidays, as per the interest and convenience of the student from the year of entry to the programme. However, minimum hours specified must be satisfied.
4. Activity Points (non-credit) have no effect on SGPA/CGPA and shall not be considered for vertical progression.
5. In case students fail to earn the prescribed Activity Points, Eighth semester Grade Card shall be issued only after earning the required Activity Points. Students shall be admitted for the award of degree only after the release of the Eighth semester Grade Card.

#### Status:

- IQAC subcommittee meeting was conducted on 16.1.2020

**Resolutions:** Mentors to track monitor and certify the activities - The mentors can seek the help of NSS officer. The NSS officer has to coordinate the activities in coordination with the concerned departments – some of the possible activities were explored

#### Proposed Implementation guidelines:

1. Current II year students to be prioritized – only THREE vacations available
2. HoDs to conduct meetings with the respective mentors
3. Mentors to form a group of four or five students
4. Activities can be viewed as: Group activities & Individual activities
5. One activity could be done during weekends leading to 20 points
6. Any sub-activity conducted for 4 hours to be awarded with 1 activity point
7. **Activity Report** : Type, Briefing of activity, 2 or 3 photos, Feedback of the beneficiaries, Certificate obtained by the authorities
8. Proposed schedule:
  1. THREE vacations – 3 activities leading to 60 points
  2. During working days – weekends & holidays – 2 activities leading to 40 points

This semester has 14 holidays (includes Sundays) excluding day before the tests and JANVEY

#### Recommendations:

- a. The implementation guidelines proposed was approved and decided to communicate to the departments. Departments may in turn advise respective mentors to use these guidelines and guide their students.
- b. Activity points to be entered into DHI platform. Dr. Jalesh Kumar is to arrange for configuring this in Mentors Role of DHI.
- c. The departments to communicate the consolidated report to the central office.



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#### 8. Agenda Point 7: Department forum activities

IQAC coordinator presented the preamble and proposal about the agenda:

##### Preamble:

- Every department has its own department forum.
- Students organize activities under the banner of these forums.
- **Objectives / Expectations:** Skill up-gradation, Industry readiness, Placement trainings

##### Status:

- Forums organize activities which are not purely technical – not exactly designed to meet required objectives

##### Proposal:

- Forum activities to be designed with specific objectives
- Should be purely technical skill-based and soft skill-based
- Avoid cultural and sports competitions at Forum levels as they are organized at institution level
- The list of activities to be submitted to IQAC and approved

Dr. Jalesh Kumar was of the opinion that some of the general / cultural & sports activities are encouraged in the department level as every student would not get the chance to participate at the institute level and it would be required to develop the students' overall personality.

Principal suggested to form a sub-committee and to design a frame work of activities along with the rules to be followed.

##### Recommendations:

- a. It was resolved to form a sub-committee comprising of Dr. K M Basappaji, Dr. Jalesh Kumar and Mr. Ajjanna N G.
- b. The sub-committee to conduct meeting with the department coordinators and decide a framework of activities.
- c. It was decided to fix a ratio of technical and general (cultural & sports) activities to be followed by all the departments.
- d. It was decided to roll out this new framework from the next academic year.

#### 9. Agenda Point 8: Student performance – improvement strategies

##### Preamble:

- Student performance in VTU examinations is very important in building the brand of the institute
- Automatically improves the placement opportunities

##### Status:

- Student performance is not very impressive (based on the last year results)
- 58 students discontinued their studies from 1.1.2019 till 24.1.2020.
- No UG ranks

#### Proposal:

- Practice of OBE – Identify Weak and Bright Students – Support / Encourage
  - Strict and frequent monitoring of student attendance and updating the status to parents
  - Coaching Classes for Slow learners
  - Special mentoring for Bright Students to achieve higher goals
  - Refine and Design Student Mentoring Process - Institute Mentor Committee to come out with separate processes for Weak & Bright students mentoring
  - Mechanism to follow up the mentoring process
  - Time table to indicate a slot for student mentoring
- Principal informed that all the processes mentioned were already in place, but the students were not found responding in the right spirit.
- All the members expressed that the student – staff interaction had to be improved.
- Mr. Suresh declared Rs. 25,000/- cash prize for the students of Mechanical Engg. Branch who secure I to V Ranks in VTU examinations.

#### Recommendations:

- a. Identify toppers / students expecting to secure ranks based on the university statistics from the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester onwards and mentor them.
- b. Strengthen student mentoring and device a mechanism to follow up mentoring process.

**10. Other Subjects:** IQAC coordinator placed before the members the details Alumni meet planned at Nellore (AP) on 29.2.2020 and informed that the post event proceedings and the outcome would be placed in the next meeting.
