1. ABOUT NES

During the freedom struggle, Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of our Nation stressed the need for quality rural education and development of women education and urged the leaders and youth to help in promoting it. Senior freedom fighters and public of Shimoga were first to respond to the call of Mahatma. In 1946 they set up the National Education Society at Shimoga which is an important place of Malnad Area of Western Ghat Region in the Country which is endowed with rich and enchanting grace of nature.

Senior leaders of the district like Mr. S.V.Krishna Murthy Rao, former Deputy Speaker of Loksabha, Mr.H.S.Rudrappa, former Minister of Karnataka. Mr. P. Murudappa, Mr. R. K. Jayatheerthachar and Mr. S. Narasimha Murthy senior Advocates, Mr. S. R. Nagappa Shresti, former MLA and a great social worker, Sri Devangi Rathnakar, Sri.Girimaji N. Rajagopal, Sri D. S. Dinakar and others, strived hard to build and nurture the institution to achieve the aspirations of Mahatma. The Society started an independently managed High School in the district during 1946 and constructed its own building with public assistance. With a view to give thrust to girls' education NES opened the first Girl's High School in the district in 1954 and gradually opened more educational institutions in rural areas of the district to cater the needs of rural people.

Sri S.R. Nagappa Shresti was a true Gandhian, who had actively participated in the freedom movement, and worked ceaselessly till his last breath for the cause of Khadhi & Village Industries as well as extension of education; served as MLA from 1952 to 1957. NES is the testimony of Sri Nagappa Shresti's greatest achievement.

Many illustrious leaders, statesmen and personalities have visited the National Education Society and have blessed by appreciating the dedicated service of the Society. Among them are Honorable Dr. Rajendra Prasad, former President of India, Philosopher educationist Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, former President of India, Shri Lal Bahadhur Shastry, former Prime Minister of India, Sri Jayachamaraj Wodeyar, former Maharaja of Mysore, Sri Vinoba Bhave, a great leader of Sarvodaya movement, Acharya Tulsi, the leader of Anavarath Movement.

Despite facing a number of problems during and after the freedom struggle, the enthusiasm and commitment of National Education Society never detered from working for the cause of education. The Society started a number of professional colleges in the district. Now it is running 35 educational institutions, providing education to more than 15,000 students with 1000 staff. Starting from giving importance to Primary, Secondary and Pre-University education by opening number of Schools and Junior Colleges, the National Education Society is now offering courses with high quality education in Engineering, Law, Commerce, Pharmacy, Applied Science and Home Science through its well-established colleges.

Thousands of Alumni of these institutions have made their name and fame by obtaining national and international recognitions in their respective fields. It is a matter of great satisfaction to the Society that its efforts to do the best in imparting good education to students have brought good results. Good number of students is coming out from its institutions with flying colours every year.

The Society is managed by an Executive Committee. The directors have taken the development of the Society as a life mission and are continuing the efforts to fulfil the aspirations of its founders. It has provided all the necessary facilities with adequate infrastructure to students and staff to promote both curricular and co-curricular activities.

All the founders of NES by their vision, hard work and contribution have brought JNNCE to the level it is today, which is being acknowledged and applauded by all. With the blessings of all, JNNCE is marching towards becoming one of the best institutions imparting education in engineering, management and computer applications to needy students and creating citizens of tomorrow.

In this direction, over the last couple of years, many such developments and improvements have been achieved, with successful milestones. An initiative "Transformation for Excellence 2.0" for making JNNCE one of the top engineering, research, innovation and enterprising institutes in the next five years was launched. Focus was set on improving the quality of education, research & innovation, infrastructure development, employability of students & few more.

Jawaharlal Nehru National College of Engineering (JNNCE) was established in the year 1980 by National Education Society (NES). JNNCE is imparting education in Technology and Management since 36 years. JNNCE is running B.E (CSE, ISE, ECE, TCE, EEE, Civil & Mechanical), M.Tech (Machine Design, Computer Integrated Manufacturing, Transportation Engineering and Management, Digital Electronics& Communication Systems, Computer Science and Networking & Internet Engg), MCA and MBA programmes. JNNCE has been recognized by All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi, and Government of Karnataka, and is affiliated to Visveswaraya Technological University, Belgaum and accredited by NBA-New Delhi and NAAC. The lush green sprawling campus of about 39.4 acres caters to the needs of nearly 3750 students and 450 staff, with state-of-the-art technology back-up, well-equipped laboratories and workshops, library, hostels, playgrounds and other amenities. The dedicated faculty of the institute comprises of nearly 46 Ph.Ds as well as 154 with PG qualifications and 4 with M.Phil., amongst whom 60 are pursuing Ph.D.

JNNCE, firmly set on realizing its vision of becoming a pace-setting institute in technical and management education and research, has been successfully producing highly competent engineers, managers and entrepreneurs to meet the needs of industry, business and the society. In this direction, the just-now concluded 2016-17 academic year has been yet another fruitful year for the institute, as manifested in several. accomplishments and new developments on all fronts, providing further impetus to its urge for excellence in the ensuing academic year 2017-18. NES Management, JNNCE Staff, Students, Alumni are constantly working towards achieving this goal.

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Glimpses of Major Achievements of the year 2016-17

Ranking/Rating:

There is remarkable improvement in overall ranking in survey done leading magazines in 2017, as mentioned below:

Ranked 46th in India among Top-75 Engineering Colleges of India in 2017 as per "The Outlook" & 7th position in Karnataka

* Academics:

Institution has so far secured over 100 ranks in university exams and during 2016 we bagged 6 ranks in VTU exam. We have introduced a mentoring process for potential rank holders as well other students to help them perform better in their examinations. We have started rewarding students who excel in their studies, cultural, sports and research & innovation, by awarding cash prizes, partial waiver of tuition fees and merit certificates.

* Research and Innovation:

Objective is set to focus on research and innovation so that education quality will improve. Our Faculty and students are pursuing research in emerging areas to solve the societal problems.

The faculty have presented and published more than 150 papers in national and international seminars, conferences and journals in the last four years. Funded Research projects worth more than Rs. 22.5 Lakhs have been carried out in the institute in this year. The institution has organized one International Conference and four National Conferences /Seminars on different academic and intellectual themes successfully, attracting resource persons, speakers and delegates from academics and industry from all over India; also brought out Conference Proceedings containing valuable information and insights.

So for 21 candidates obtained Ph.D. degrees from JNNCE under Research Centre of VTU.

During the year, the College has also launched a bi-annual, in-house newsletter titled "JNNCE Beacon" to showcase the events and developments on the campus.

Many projects catering to the need of the society are being developed; few of them are:

- Innovative Pervious paver blocks which is intended to avoid Water stagnation over pedestrian sidewalks and to recharge the ground water,
- > IOT for HOME to make all the home appliances controlled by an Android app,
- > Automatic Fetal Detection in Ultrasound Images for early detection of abnormality,
- Target Eliminator & Home Security Surveillance for smarter way to provide home security,

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- Computational Genomics- Development of search tool, sequencing and analysis tools for Scientists and Research scholars in the field of Genomics,
- > AROGYA MITRA for emergency alerts and early diagnosis of disorder,
- > Internet of Things for Optimization of power dissipation in campus for efficient utilization of power controlling the lights through Android mobile etc.

JNNCE has submitted more than 25 research proposals seeking funding from Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, AICTE, KCTU, Govt. of Karnataka. Few among them are project proposal under DHI-TPEM Technology Platform for Electric Mobility under DST and Consortia is formed between JNNCE, Smart Energy Solutions, Mysore, CSIO–CSIR, BITS, Pilani, IITM, Ann Arbor Michigan, Kinetic Motors, Volvo.

We are aggressively moving towards establishing Industry-Institute collaboration to foster practical knowledge among faculty and students. In this direction, we have signed MOUs with many companies such as:

- Qualitas Technologies, Bengaluru to work in the areas of Hyperspectral image processing and deep learning for machine vision system and
- Laser Consult Kft, Hungary for R&D, Technology transfer and commercialization, Gardenia Group,

Placement:

In addition to education and research, we are focusing on providing skill-based training to students improve their employability. To prepare students, we are providing soft skill training, exposed to emerging technologies by way of technical talks by Industry experts, hands-on workshops in emerging and niche technology areas like Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning, IoT, Data Science, Additive Manufacturing, Gypum Fiber Reinforced Glass (GFRB) based construction, Satellite Communication etc,. Also we have created the platform to pursue their projects in emerging technology fields and involve in research projects focusing social issues, agriculture, manufacturing, low-cost construction of building, healthcare, finance, etc.

More than 388 students from 2016-17 batch have got job offers through campus placement in companies like BEL, TCS, Evive Health, Tech Mahindra, Crimson Logic, Global Edge, Colors Software, Societe Generale, Ethnus etc. Highest salary offered during 2016-17 is Rs.6.15 Lakhs per annum and average salary is Rs.4.5 lakhs per annum.

Students Chapters of Professional Bodies:

Several professional bodies' Student Chapters are active in JNNCE, which help the students to become team players and develop leadership qualities. We have chapters of: Institution of Engineers (India), The Institution of Electronics and Telecommunication Engineers (IETE),

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National Service Scheme (NSS), Computer Society of India, Society for Automotive, Indian Institute of Foundry men etc.

✤ Quality Improvement in Education:

Unlike the conventional method of teaching, JNNCE is practicing 'Outcome Based Education', where every subject taught has certain objectives to be fulfilled, which further fulfill the objectives of the department.

In this direction, apart from the regular teaching,

- Many workshops and faculty development programs are organized to gain practical exposure to the latest technologies currently used in industries.
- Students are encouraged to participate in state and national level technical competitions conducted by various organizations throughout India.
- Department level committees are constituted for (i) Academic Improvement (ii) Placement and Training (iii) R&D, Industry-Institute interaction.
- Professional trainers are invited to teach life skills to students not only for campus interviews but also to prepare them for future career.
- Student feed-back is taken, which helps in faculty self-assessment.
- Open textbook tests are conducted to ensure that students study throughout the semester and not only during the exam time.
- Flipped classes are being planned, where the notes, ppts and lecture videos are uploaded, to help students to do better.
- Encouraging students to use web resources offered by VTU and NPTEL by IIT's

Conferences, Workshops, Symposiums organized:

On a regular basis, all the departments organize and participate in conferences and workshops as part of continuous learning program, in association with bodies like CSR, DRDO, NBHM, ISTE, IIT Bombay, IIT Khargpur, IETE etc. In last three years, JNNCE has organized about 30 workshops; the faculty has attended about 40 workshops/conferences and 35 resource persons have visited JNNCE as guest speakers, paving the way for knowledge enhancement.

Contribution to Society by Staff and Students:

Our staff and students are also involved in various activities contributing to the society. Be it visiting rural areas, blood donation camps, awareness camps, reaching to school children, go green projects, helping the district administration or reaching out to the needy for assistance, they are everywhere! Few of them are: Participating in Pulse polio program, Cow donation and Youth parliament. Faculty from basic sciences departments are actively organising in CET coaching classes for PU students every year, Internet awareness program for housewives and senior citizens, Workshop on electronics, electricals and physics for high school students for

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over 300 students; staff serve as experts / committee members in district administration and Government departments, providing financial assistance to meritorious and economically backward students in the form of scholarships, organizing Blood Donation Camps in association with Rotary clubs, Red Cross Society and Govt. Mc-Gann Hospital etc.

***** Library & Information System:

The institute library, housed in an exclusive and spacious block, has a collection of 1,08,328 books relating to all branches of Engineering and Management, the digital library subscribes to 42 National & International Journals with e-journals through VTU Consortium and DELNET. The Library has been computerized with e-Lib software.

✤ Alumni:

More than 15,000 students who have passed out of this institution have been making significant contributions in Industries, R&D organizations, Academic Institutions and Govt. Organizations in India and abroad and areserving their alma-mater.

The institute has an active and supportive Alumni Association, which meets regularly and involves itself in the development of the institution by undertaking various activities. The vast alumni community has been brought on board by registration of Alumni Aoosciation, launching a dedicated website, holding Global Alumni Meet, instituting Distinguished Alumni Awards, co-opting alumni in various administrative cells and panels, securing scholarships, internships, placements & sponsorships for our students, etc.


