1. ABOUT NES

During the Freedom struggle, Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of our Nation stressed the need for quality rural education and development of women education and urged the leaders and youth to help in promoting it. Senior Freedom fighters and public of Shimoga were first to respond to the call of Mahatma. In 1946 they set up the National education society at Shimoga which is the important place of Malnad Area of Western Ghat Region in the Country which is endowed with rich and enchanting grace of Nature.

The Society, with the zeal dedication of senior leaders of the district like Mr. S.V.Krishna Murthy Rao, former deputy speaker of Loksabha, Mr.H.S.Rudrappa, Former Minister of Karnataka. Mr. P. Murudappa, Mr. R. K. Jayatheerthachar and Mr. S. Narasimha Murthy senior Advocates, Mr. S. R.Nagappa Shrestty, Ex-MLA and a great social worker and others strived hard to build the institution as founders to achieve the aspirations of Mahatma. The society started independently Managed High School in the district during 1946 and constructed its own building with public assistance. With a view to give thrust towards girl's education NES opened the first Girl's High School in the district in 1954 and gradually opened educational institutions in rural areas of the district to cater the needs of rural people.

Many illustrious leaders, statesman, personalities have visited the National education Society and have blessed by appreciating the dedicated service of the society. Among them are Honorable Dr. Rajendra Prasad, former President of India, Philosopher educationist Dr. S. Radha Krishnan, former president of India, Shri Lal Bahadhur Shastry, Former Prime Minister of India, Sri Jayachamaraj wodeyar, former Maharaja of Mysore, Sri Vinoba Bhave a great leader of Sarvodaya movement, Acharya Tulsi, the leader of Anavarath Movement are few among them.

Despite number of problems during and after freedom struggle the enthusiasm and commitment of National Education Society never detered towards working for the cause of education. The society started number of professional Colleges in the district. Now it is running 40 educational institutions providing education to more than 15,000 students with 1000 staff force. Starting from giving importance to Primary, Secondary and Pre-University education by opening number of Schools and Junior Colleges, the National Education Society is offering courses with high quality education in Engineering, Law, Commerce, Pharmacy, Applied Science and Home Science through its well established colleges.

Thousands of Alumni of these institutions have made their name and fame earned by obtaining national and international recognitions in their respective fields. 3. ABOUT JNNCE

All the founders of NES by their vision, hard work and contribution have brought JNNCE to the level it is today, which is being acknowledged and applauded by all. With the blessings of all, JNNCE is marching towards becoming one of the best institutions imparting education in engineering, management and computer application to needy students and creating citizens of tomorrow.

In this direction, over the last couple of years, many such developments and improvements have been achieved, with successful milestones. During July 2016, an initiative "Transformation for Excellence 2.0" for making JNNCE one of the top engineering, research, innovation and enterprising institutes was started. During this journey, the focus was on improving the quality of education, research & innovation, infrastructure development, employability of students & few more.

Jawaharlal Nehru New College of Engineering (JNNCE)[Formerly, Jawaharlal Nehru National College of Engineering (JNNCE)] was established in the year 1980 by National Education Society (NES). JNNCE is imparting education in Technology and Management since 41 years. JNNCE is running B.E (Civil, Mechanical, EEE, ECE,CSE, ISE, ETE & AI & ML), M.Tech (Transportation Engineering and Management, Computer Science), MCA and MBA programmes. JNNCE has been recognized by All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) New Delhi, and Government of Karnataka, and is affiliated to Visveswaraya Technological University, Belgaum and accredited by NBA-New Delhi and NAAC. The lush green sprawling campus of about 39.4 acres caters to the needs of nearly 3750 students and 450 staff, with state-of-the-art technology back-up, well-equipped laboratories and workshops, library, hostels, playgrounds and other amenities. The dedicated faculty of the institute comprises of nearly 47 Ph.Ds as well as 133 with PG qualifications, amongst whom 57 are pursuing Ph.D.

JNNCE, firmly set on realizing its vision of becoming a pace-setting institute in technical and management education and research, has been successfully producing highly competent engineers, managers and entrepreneurs to meet the needs of industry, business and the society. In this

direction, the just-now concluded 2020-21 academic year has been yet another fruitful year for the institute, as manifested in the above accomplishments and new developments on all fronts, providing further impetus to its urge for excellence in the ensuing academic year 2021-22. NES Management, JNNCE Staff, Students, Alumni are constantly working towards achieving this goal.

❖ Ranking/Rating:

There is remarkable improvement in overall ranking in survey done leading magazines in 2020, as mentioned below:

❖ Academics:

Institution has so far secured over 100 ranks in university exams and during 2020-21 we bagged 3 ranks in VTU exam. We have introduced a mentoring process for potential rank holders as well other students to help them perform better in their examinations. We have started rewarding students who excel in their studies, cultural, sports and research & innovation, by awarding cash prizes, partial waiver of tuition fees and merit certificates. We organize Graduation Day which is unique where in all students become eligible for Graduation (Graduands).

* Research and Innovation:

The Objective is set to focus on research and innovation so that education quality will improve.

Our Faculty and students are pursuing research in emerging areas to solve the societal problems.

The faculty have presented and published more than 250 papers in national and international seminars, conferences and journals in the last five years. Funded Research projects worth more than Rs. 42.65 Lakhs have been carried out in the institute in this year. The institution has organized three International Conferences on different academic and intellectual themes successfully, attracting resource persons, speakers and delegates from academics and industry from all over India; also brought out Conference Proceedings containing valuable information and insights. To

motivate innovation-based research among faculty and students, JNNCE Research and Innovation Centre in JNNCE (JNNRIC) started in 2017-18 has been functioning. So for, 46 candidates obtained Ph.D. degrees from JNNCE under Research Centre of VTU.

To encourage research and publication, the institute had launched its own online bi-annual research journal, titled "JNNCE Journal of Engineering & Management" (JJEM) in October 2017; four issues, containing research papers from scholars, both from India and abroad, have been already released and the tenth issue is now under process.

The College has also continued to publish its bi-annual, in-house newsletter titled "JNNCE Beacon" to showcase the events and developments on the campus.

Many projects catering to the need of the society are being developed; few of them are:

- Portable Graphene-Oxide, Vetiver Grass And Uv Light Based Multistage Filtration Unit For Water Purification
- Automated Wheel Chair Navigation And Health Monitoring Through Open-Computer Vision Using Raspberry
- Smart Milk Vending Machine Using lot
- Phytoremediation of waste water from casting industry using native plants
- Marine Robot using RADAR system(River cleaning ROBOT)
- Smart Glass For Blind People
- High Strength 3D Printing for Sand Casting
- Development of a readymade pothole mix for distressed pavements
- Treatment and reuse of automobile service station wastewater by using natural coagulants
- Natural bio adsorbents and coagulants for removal for heavy metals from contaminated water

JNNCE has received funding from NewGen Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Center (NewGen IEDC) under the aegis of NSTEDB, DST, Govt. of India at JNNCE with grant of Rs. 2.87 Crore over a period of 5 years. JNNCE is one of the Institutions obtained this grant among 250+ institutions that had submitted applications and only college in Karnataka, who got this grant. Objective of this grant is to create the platform for Innovation & Entrepreneurship and create companies with objective of generating revenue, creating jobs and wealth. During 2020-21, fifteen projects have been funded with 2.5 lakhs each.

JNNCE has received more than 42 Lakhs funding from funding agencies like Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, AICTE, Govt. of Karnataka.

We are also aggressively moving in establishing Industry-Institute collaboration to foster the practical knowledge among Faculty and students. In this direction, we have signed MOUs with many companies such as:

- Avijeet Agencies (P) Ltd.
- Govt. Tool Room and Training Center, Shivamogga
- Global Infotech Autodesk Academic Partner
- University of Agricultural and Horticultural Sciences, Navile, Shivamogga

Placement:

In addition to education and research, we are focusing to provide skill-based training to increase their employability. To prepare students, we are providing soft skill training, exposed to emerging technologies by way of technical talks by Industry experts, hands-on workshops in emerging and niche technology areas like Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning, IoT, Data Science, Satellite Communication etc,. Also we have created the platform to pursue their projects in emerging technology fields and involve in research projects focusing social issues, agriculture, manufacturing, low-cost construction of building, healthcare, finance, etc.

More than 525 students from 2020-21 batch have got job offers during campus placement in companies like TCS, Evive Health, Crimson Logic, Global Edge, Colors Software, SOCIETE GENERALE, ETHNUS etc. Highest salary offered during 2020-21 is Rs.8.00 Lakhs per annum and average salary is Rs.3.5 lakhs per annum.

Students Chapters of Professional Bodies:

Several professional bodies' Student Chapters are active in JNNCE, which help the students to become team players and develop leadership qualities. We have chapters of: Institution of Engineers (India), The Institution of Electronics and Telecommunication Engineers (IETE), Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) Students Branch, National Service Scheme (NSS), Computer Society of India, Society for Automotive, Indian Institute of Foundry men, SAE etc.

Quality Improvement in Education:

Unlike the conventional method of teaching, JNNCE is practicing 'Outcome Based Education', where every subject taught has certain objectives to be fulfilled, which further fulfill the objectives of the department.

In this direction, apart from the regular teaching,

- Many workshops and faculty development programs are organized to gain practical exposure about the latest technologies currently used in industries.
- Students are encouraged to participate in state and national level technical competitions conducted by various organizations throughout India.
- Department level committees are constituted for (i) Academic Improvement (ii) Placement and Training (iii) R&D, Industry-Institute interaction.
- Professional trainers are invited to teach life skills to students not only for campus interviews but also to prepare them for future.
- Student feed-back is taken, which helps self-assessment.
- Open textbook tests are conducted to ensure that students study throughout the semester and not only during the exam time.
- Google Class rooms are being used, where the notes, ppts and lecture videos are uploaded, so that it would help students to do better.
- Encouraging students to use web resources offered by VTU and NPTEL by IIT's

Conferences, Workshops, Symposiums organized:

On a regular basis, all the departments organize and participate in conferences and workshops as part of continuous learning program, in association with bodies like CSR, DRDO, NBHM, ISTE, IIT Bombay, IIT Khargpur, IETE etc. In last three years, JNNCE has organized about 76 technical events; the faculty has attended about 926 Faculty Development Programs / Seminars / Webinars and around 8 conferences and 75 resource persons have visited JNNCE as guest speakers, paving the way for knowledge enhancement.

Contribution to Society by Staff and Students:

Our staff and students are also involved in various activities contributing to the society. Be it visiting rural areas, blood donation camps, awareness camps, reaching to school children, go green projects, helping the district administration or reaching out to the needy for assistance, they are everywhere! Few of them are: Participating in Pulse polio program, Cow donation and Youth

parliament. Faculty from basic sciences departments are actively participating in CET coaching classes for PU students every year, Internet awareness program for housewives and senior citizens, Workshop on electronics, electrical and physics for high school students for over 400 students, staff as experts / committee members in district administration and Government departments, providing financial assistance to meritorious and economical backward students in the form of scholarships, organizing Blood Donation Camps in association with Rotary, Red Cross and Govt. McGann Hospital etc.

Library & Information System:

The institute library, housed in an exclusive and spacious block, has a collection of 1,23,657 books relating to all branches of Engineering and Management, digital library, subscribes to 53 National & 9 International Journals with more than 2500 e-journals through VTU Consortium and DELNET. The Library has been computerized with e-Lib iNext Web based software. Also, institute is identified as NPTL local chapter.

❖ Alumni:

More than 17,000 students who have passed out of this institution have been making significant contributions in Industries, R&D organizations, Academic Institutions and Govt. Organizations in India and abroad and serving their alma-mater.

The institute has registered alumni association which is active and supportive that meets regularly during the month of May every year and involves itself in the development of the institution by undertaking various activities. The vast alumni community has been brought on board by registration of Alumni Association, launching a dedicated website, holding Global Alumni Meet, instituting Distinguished Alumni Awards, co-opting alumni in various administrative cells and panels, securing scholarships, internships, placements & sponsorships for our students, etc.


